Learning in Term 4

**Health and Wellbeing**

This term will involve exploring the Relationships, Sexual Health and Parenthood (RSHP) curricula resources; Level 2, Initial (P5) or Progression 1 (P6), covering the topics of emotions, love, sex, pregnancy and parenthood. As part of P.E., we will be learning and practising various athletic activities (throwing, running and jumping events) to prepare us for sports day (provisionally set for 11<sup>th</sup>/12<sup>th</sup> June P6 and P5 respectively).

**Literacy**

Forms of writing to be explored this term include persuasive, informational, recount, and imaginative. Persuasive will link to our topics of P5/6 Food, P6 Advertising, P5 Renewable Energy. Recount writing will follow on from our school trip to watch "Chitty Chitty Bang Bang" at HMT, Aberdeen on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> June. Imaginative writing will again be used to support our cold writing assessment. Guided reading sessions and Accelerated Reader will continue as usual.

**Numeracy**

Topics being covered in numeracy include decimals, fractions and percentages, along with measure (length, volume, and mass), and time. Pupils will also look to continually reinforce fluency with the four number operations.

**Other Curricular Areas**

Opera rehearsals will continue for Primary 6 until the final performance on Friday 31<sup>st</sup> May (14:00). Invitations will be prepared and issued soon. P5 will continue with electricity before moving on to renewable energy. P6 and P5 will both look at Food and Health with P6 developing this further to look at food advertising. P5/6 also have a series of sessions of drum fun on Friday mornings.

Homework

Homework will begin on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> April. Homework will be issued on the Tuesday of each week and should be returned the following Monday in your child's homework jotter. Homework will comprise of maths, spelling and reading. Reading records will accompany guided reading books outlining what should be read at home. A reminder that homework is not issued on short weeks. For more information, please see the accompanying sheet issued home with the homework jotter.
