Learning in Term 4

Health and Wellbeing

This term will involve exploring the Relationships, Sexual Health and Parenthood (RSHP) curricula resources; Level 2, Progression 1, covering the topics of emotions, love, sex, pregnancy and parenthood. As part of P.E., we will be learning and practising various athletic activities (throwing, running and jumping events) to prepare us for sports day (provisionally set for 11th June).

Literacy

Forms of writing to be explored this term include persuasive, informational, recount, and imaginative. Persuasive will link to our topic of Food and Media, where we will be marketing and producing a new food product. Information (factual) writing will link to our second topic of Victorians later in the term, whilst recount writing will follow on from our school trip to watch "Chitty Chitty Bang Bang" at HMT, Aberdeen on Thursday 13th June. Imaginative writing will again be used to support our cold writing assessment. Guided reading sessions and Accelerated Reader will continue as usual.

Numeracy

Numeracy topics being covered this term include decimals and measure (length, volume, and mass). Using existing knowledge of decimals and fractions, we will explore converting decimals between percentages and fractions to solve problems. We will also look to continually reinforce our fluency with the four number operations. On Tuesdays, Miss Jones will teach money and time.

Other Curricular Areas

Opera rehearsals will continue until the final performance on Friday 31st May (14:00). Invitations will be prepared and issued soon. Alongside the opera, pupils will explore the historical significance of the Victorian era as well as develop knowledge of nutrition and learn skills involved in being an entrepreneur as part of Food and Media. With learning an additional second language (experiencing at least three languages in total), pupils will learn basic conversational vocabulary (greetings, numbers, about me) in Polish. There may also be opportunities to learn more about the country and its culture, with support from a number of pupils within the class.

Homework

Homework will begin on Tuesday 23rd April. Homework will be issued on the Tuesday of each week and should be returned the following Monday in your child's homework jotter. Homework will comprise of maths, spelling and reading. Reading records will accompany guided reading books outlining what should be read at home. A reminder that homework is not issued on short weeks. For more information, please see the accompanying sheet issued home with the homework jotter.
